

- Bill Number: 5463
 - Common Student Identifier between community and technical colleges
- Bill Number: 1808
 - Master list of postsecondary course that can be fulfilled by taking recognized college level proficiency exams such as AP, IB, and CLEP and meeting qualifying score
 - Provide master list of courses to OSPI for distribution to school districts
- Bill Number: 1795
 - List of common courses transferable to all four-year public colleges
 - Increase awards of academic credit for Prior Learning
 - One-year Academic Credential
