DUAL CREDIT UPDATES

Senate Bill 6374

The 2020 Legislature passed Senate Bill 6374, expanding the Dual Enrollment Scholarship pilot program (HB 1973) to cover apprenticeship materials for eligible students. Due to this expansion, the RS portion of the pilot program opened a competitive application process and selected 6 additional colleges to serve as pilot sites (Highline, Everett, Skagit, Spokane, Green River, CWU).

SUMMER RUNNING START PROGRAM

- Running Start 2021 summer pilot program ([HB 2864](#)).
- Three selected colleges will collaborate with their partner districts to offer Running Start courses
- Limited to 5 credits per summer session to incoming 11th and 12th grade students in Summer 2021 and Summer 2022.
- Seniors who are one class short of receiving their AA may take 5 credits
- 2020-2022 grant applications are due October 23, 2020; Notice of approval November 13, 2020; Allocations begin as soon as possible following approval

AP/IB/CI CROSSWALKS

- AP Scores Crosswalk published/posted
- IB Scores Crosswalk published/posted
- **Cambridge Scores Crosswalk 2019, reviewed and approved by Instruction Council; to be posted and published by November 2020**



LPN-TO-BSN

- Collaborative committee with multiple stakeholders from all higher education sectors and key stakeholders (ex. Nursing Commission)
- DRAFT LPN-to-BSN Ladder Pathway: Applicants could transfer up to 90 lower division credits + 30 credits from prior LPN training
- Committee determining feasibility of this model
- Mapping the specific details (ex. common content, curricular pathway(s), admission requirements, etc.)
- Equity (ex. admissions, retentions, etc.)
- LPN-to-BSN DTA/MRP is also being considered

GUIDED PATHWAYS (GP)

- Individual college GP workplans were due in late September
- Identify top three areas of focus
- GP Advisory Committee met recently
- Priority 1-Math Pathways
- Priority 2-Onboarding and Access
- Priority 3-Leadership and Student Voice/Engagement
- GP Strategic Alignment and Equity Implications
 - Nationally researcher indicates that colleges are doing a good job with providing professional development or training related to equity; however implementation of equity practices is not prolific.

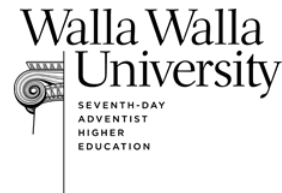

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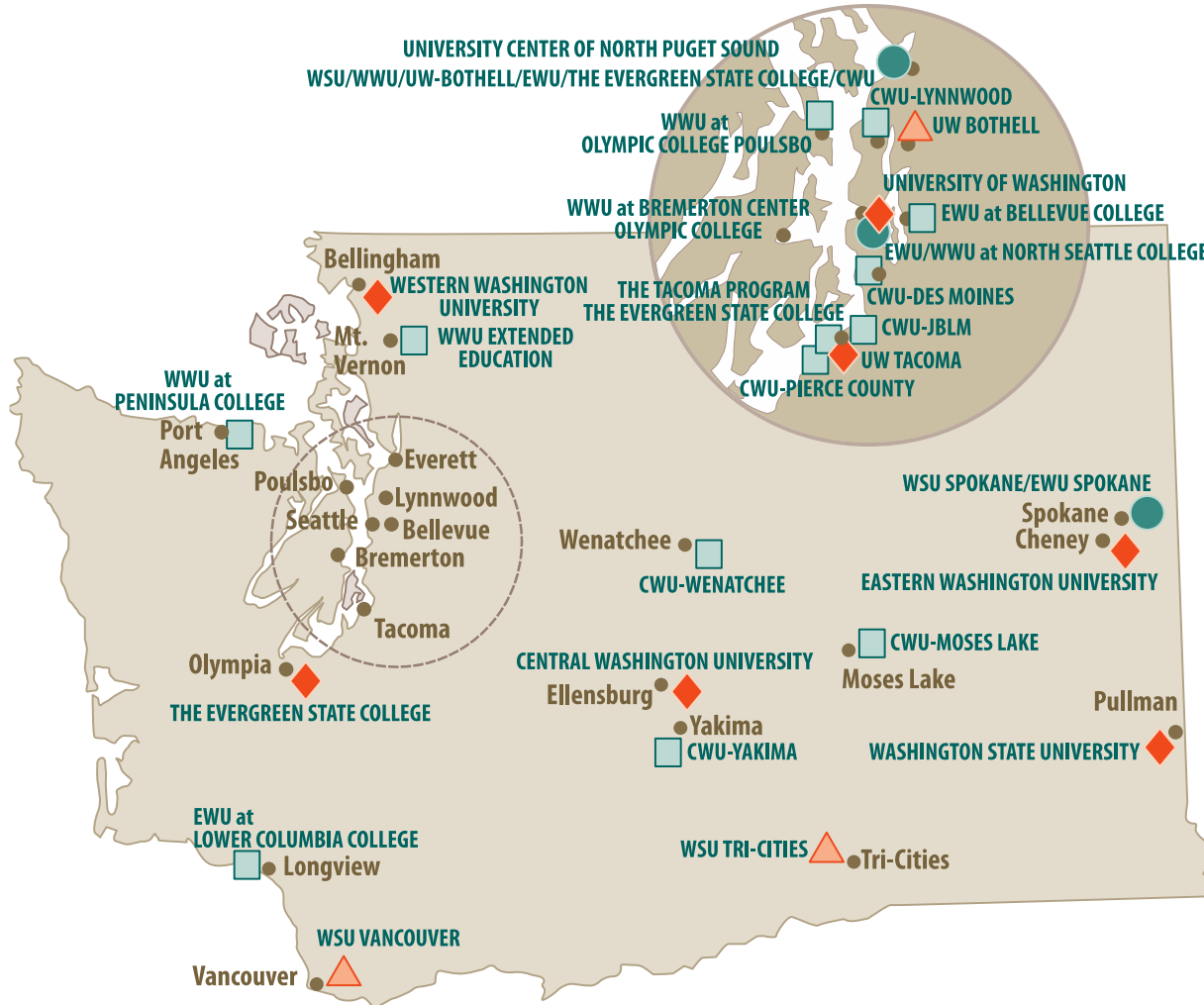

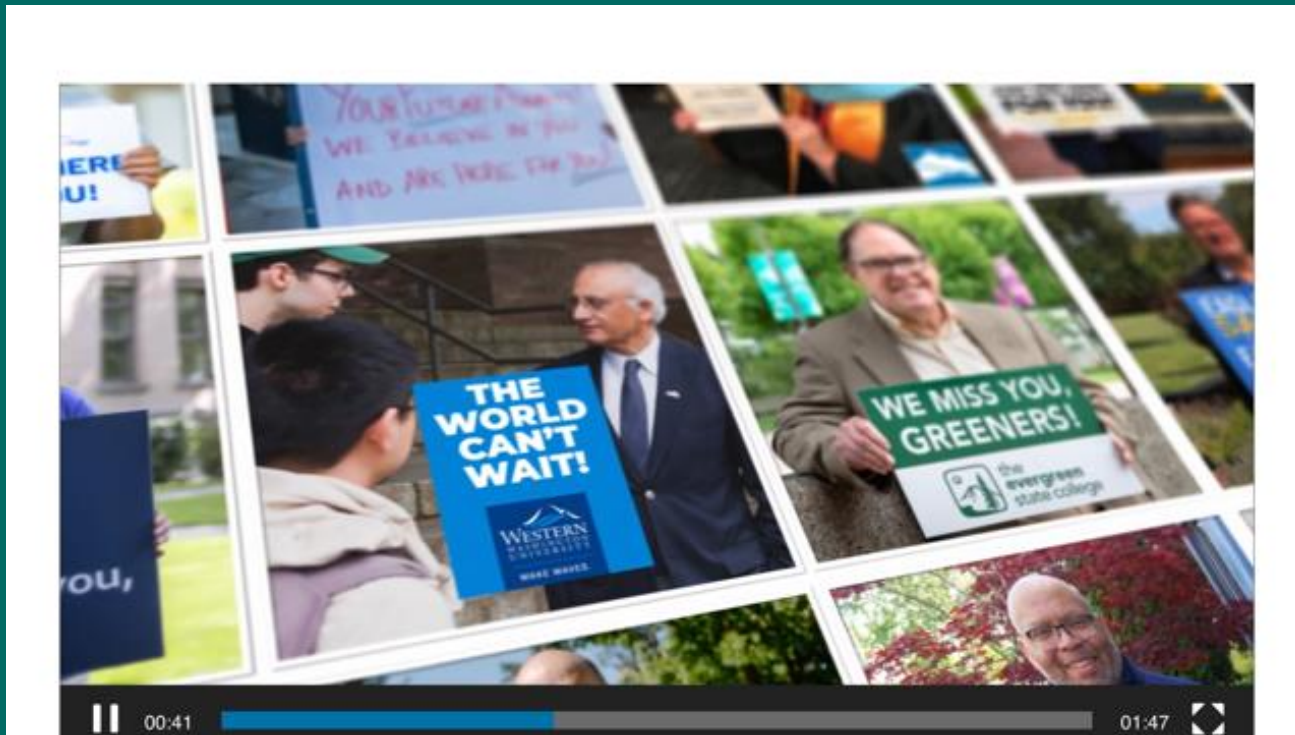

Joint Statement from the Council of Presidents

October 2020

The COVID-19 pandemic has tested our collective resolve as never before. 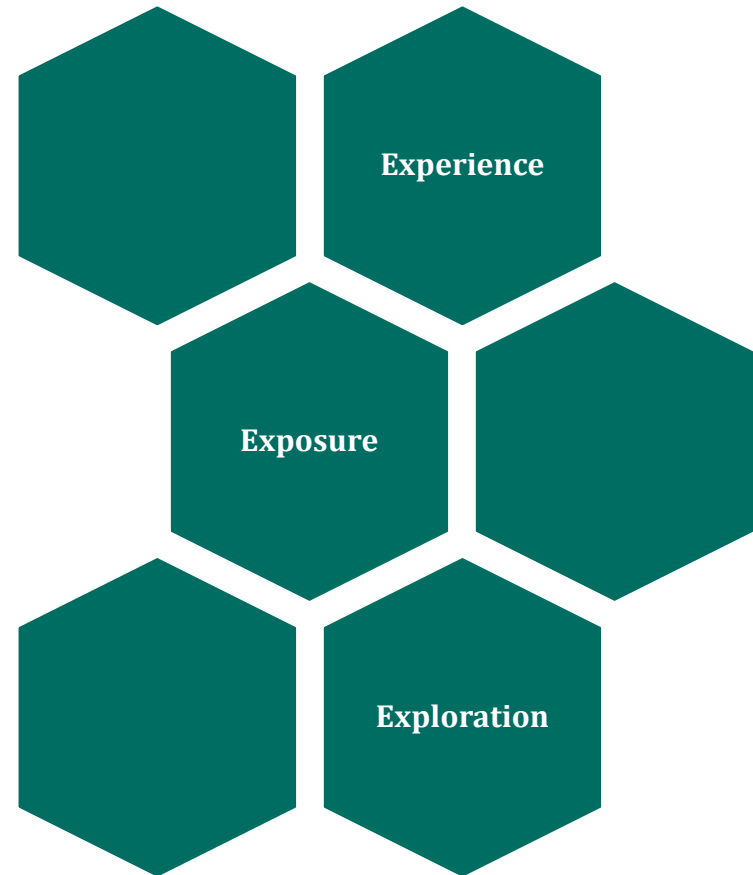
